Lexington's system-wide planning includes initiatives to improve social and emotional program supports for all students.

The LPS School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) helps promote wellness programs and runs Lexington's Parent Academy. The high school's Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) club supports substance abuse prevention, including "Crash Day."
